## Your Roadmap

The history of the National Studfarm of Saint-Lô Enter through the gate at the main entrance and go to the statue on the wall of stable 5.

The Hornez Carousel

Go straight to the center aisle and turn left. Now head towards the Hornez riding arena.

The Remarkable Trees

Take the paved path towards the giant sequoia.

The Forge

Continue on your left and you will find the Forge a few meters away. If the door is open then please venture inside and take a look around.

The Garden of the Incredible Edibles

As you exit the Forge, walk alongside the hedge on your left. You will soon find the garden. Psssst... If you look around you may see horses !

The Pavillion of Honour

Continue straight and at the "STOP" sign turn right. Arriving near the stables, turn left then walk along stables 1 and 2 to the Pavillion of honour.

Go near the small wall in front of the English Garden. Here you will find the Paddocks.




Discovery of the Norman Breeds

### Before we start, let's learn a little more about the National Studfarm of Saint-Lô

A Haras is a place dedicated to the breeding of horses.

The Haras Nationaux (National Studfarms) were, at the time useful for bringing together horses that went to war (since there were no vehicles) The site where you are is made up of two places :

The Haras National which presents the historical part and sightseeing

The Pole hippique (Equine centre) for horse breedind and competitions

# The history of the National Studfarm of Saint-Lô

You are at the entrance to the Haras National of Saint-Lô. It is a place filled with history.

The National Studfarm was created in 1806 under the order of Napoléon Bonaparte. It was created to accomodate war horses.

But it was in 1886 that the current stud farm was completed. During the bombings of June 1944, the stud farm was largely destroyed, it was rebuilt and enlarged.

Saint-Lô is very famous for competitions.

Did you know when a horse and its rider win a competition they receive a prize? Its called a rosette (a flot in French).

Do you know who Saint-Eloi is?

Saint-Eloi was the Patron Saint of farriers. He was a blacksmith and farrier in the 6th century. He shoed the horses of farmers, lords and travellers.

Saint-Eloi is celebrated every year on 1st December.





The arena is a working space for horses to train and prepare for competitions.

Breeding competitions are held here as well as cultural events such as concerts...

You can go up to the first floor to get a closer look at the trainig of the horses. To do this, take the door to the left of the building. But be careful...the horse can be an anxious animal, so please don't make too much noise!

You can observe from there the frame of the carousel. Everything is metal. The roof reminds me of a man in particular...


# 3 The Giant Sequoia and the Remarkable Trees

You will notice throughout your journey some incredible and gigantic trees. We call these the remarkable trees, they are exceptional in their age, size and shape. They were planted during the construction of the Studfarm in 1886.

#### You are now in front of the Giant Sequoia

The tree you see in front of you is 130 years old and is already 34 meters high. This tree can live for thousands of years.

You are here in the Forge. This is where the horses are shoed.

Do you know the name of the craftsman who shoes horses hooves......?

It's a farrier. In French it's a maréchal-ferrant. He is the shoemaker for horses. H e takes care of the horses feet. He puts on shoes adapted to each horse. It is a profession dating back to over 2000 years and one which is becoming more and more rare.

There are four steps to shoeing a horse. Can you put them in the right order ?

A. The farrier then moulds the iron. He heats it in the forge to give it the desired shape.

B. Once the shoes are well suited to the horses feet, the farrier cools them down.

C. The horse feet are cleaned and resized? This is called trimming.


D. The Farrier begins by moving the old shoes.

# 5 The garden of the Incredible Edibles

You are here at the entrance to the garden of the incredible edibles.

This garden is managed by the association "Graines de partage". In english this means "sharing seeds"... It is a collective vegetable garden where there are vegetables (tomatoes, cucumbers...) and many different herbs. Volunteers come every Sunday to help maintain the garden and greenhouse.



### MAKE YOUR OWN STOCK CUBE

### WHAT ARE THE INGREDIENTS?

- → 4 cloves of garlic
  - ->> I bouquet garni ( chives, basil, tarragon for example)
    - 2 tablespoons of olive oil
  - ->> I tablespoon of white vinegar
- ->> I pinch of salt



### The recipe :



Peel the garlic gloves and the onion and chop finely.



Remove the seeds and chop the pepper into small pieces.



Choose which herbs you would like in the bouquet garni (wash them before use !).



Boil 1 litre of water and add all the ingredients.



Leave in a covered pot for two hours.


Pour the liquid into individual ice trays and place in the freeze. Once frozen they will last up to 3 months.

And there you go ! You have created your own stock cube !



Here we are in front of the Pavillion of Honour

The Pavillion of Honour is the central element and the historic heart of the stud farm. It was used to house the directors of the stud farm. Today it is no longer inhabited and sometimes it is used as a reception hall and meeting room for te equestrian centre.

The English Garden is a garden of relaxation. It was the personal garden of the director. Today, it hosts many picnic events, dance performances, fetes....




A paddock is an enclosure where the horse can relax on its own or in a group. This place allows them to leave their stables. It is their play area.

## The Norman Breeds

#### The French Saddle (Selle Français)

It is the most popular breed in France and it comes from Normandy. It is a sport horse that is often found in show jumping !

The Normandy Cob (Cob Normand)

It is a breed of horse often used for carriage driving and leisure. It is a fairly light horse since it only weighs between 500 and 800 kg

### The Cotentin Donkey (L'Âne du Cotentin)

It is an easily recognisable animal thanks to its blue-grey coat. In the olden days it was used to transport milk. Today it is used for recreation

#### The Percheron (Le Percheron)

This is a unique and powerful horse. In adulthood it can easily weigh up to 1000 kg. Today it is used for leisure, driving and some work.


